PITTSBURGH, February 22, 2005 - The Koppers plant in Somerville, Texas, has achieved ISO 14001 certification for its Environmental Management System (EMS).

The Somerville wood treating plant has been owned by Koppers since 1995. The facility produces pressure-treated wood crossties and switch ties for the railroad industry.

The international standard allows Koppers to implement cost-effective procedures that are applicable worldwide.
